Recent Developments in Psychiatric Ethics: Standards of Care & Third-Party Duties

This grand rounds presentation will discuss recent developments in psychiatric ethics with an emphasis on third-party duties and evolving standards of care including issues related to foreseeability, the duty to warn and the scope of the physician-patient relationship. In particular, the talk will focus on the implications of three major contemporary cases: *Safer v. Pack* (New Jersey, 1996), *Volk v. DeMeerler* (Washington, 2016) and *Warren v. Dinter* (Minnesota, 2019). Each of these cases has the potential to reshape the daily practice of psychiatry and raise unsettling ethical challenges.
