Dr. Gerber will review the current state of the art in terms of clinical applications for psychiatric neuroimaging, providing a framework for what is not currently evidence based and what is. He will describe new potential applications of neuroimaging and anticipate how they will become more widespread in the coming years in psychiatric settings. As part of this, he will also describe the current ongoing presence of a mind-body dualism in the psychiatric diagnostic and treatment nomenclature and propose how to move past this as part of an improved and more patient-centered framework.

OBJECTIVES

2. Participants will be able to describe solutions to the current mind-body dichotomy in psychiatric diagnosis and treatments
